ALLERGIES AWARE

PARKING

Due to limited space, the school car park is only for use by disabled badge holders, school staff and those hiring the Betteridge Room (i.e. Sedgberrow Preschool). We realise that the village can get very busy, especially at collection time but we do ask that parents avoid parking on the single yellow lines and especially the zig zag lines outside school. These are there for the safety of all and to allow emergency vehicle and bus access. We ask you to park carefully and responsibly even if that means a longer walk to the school gate. We form part of a wider community in the village of Sedgeberrow and it is important that we continue to have good relationships with everyone. SCHOOL LUNCHES AND FREE SCHOOL MEALS

Our school lunches are provided by Class Catering and brought to us each day from their kitchen at The De Montfort School. Menus are available through ParentPay. Please book (and pay if applicable) by Wednesday 9.30am for the following week. Cancellations for illness etc can be done through ParentPay up to 9.30am on the day your child is absent. All Reception, Year One and Year Two children are entitled to a free school meal paid through the Government's Universal Free School Meal Scheme. You will still need to order your child's lunch via ParentPay.

Free School Meals can also be awarded if you or your partner are claiming either;

- Universal Credit provided they have an annual net earned income not exceeding £7,400 (616.67 per month)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190, as assessed by HMRC

Working Tax Credit run-on-paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax

If you think you may be eligible, please complete a form online even if you already receive a meal as part of the Universal FSM Scheme, as the school will receive extra money paid for each child who is eligible for free school meals, which is used to support your child's education.

HEALTHY SNACKS/MILK

KS1 will be provided with a healthy snack at break time through the 'Fruit for Schools' scheme. KS2 children should bring a healthy snack. Please cut grapes and cherry tomatoes in half to reduce the risk of choking. Children under the age of five are entitled to free milk and those over the age of five can pay a subsidised rate of around £14 per term. If you would like your child to receive milk, you will need to register online at www.coolmilk.com or you can pick up a leaflet from the school office.

MORNING CLUB

Morning Club is our early drop off facility that supervises children from **8.00-8.45am and costs £20 per half term**. If you have not already signed up for morning club and wish to use it during this term, please speak to the school office for details. We will continue to require parents to sign up and pay for morning club half-termly in advance, with all payments completed via ParentPay. The hall doors will open at **8.00am,8.15am and 8.30am only** – this is to enable the staff to effectively supervise all of the children in their care. Please wait with your child until they are under the supervision of our staff.



PARENTS EVENING

We are offering a video call parents' evening appointment for each pupil on the **8th November**

2023 with 10 minute appointments available between 3.30pm and 8pm.

Sign up will be from **Monday 23rd October** via our School Cloud System.

More information about how to sign up and log on will be available nearer the time. This is an opportunity for an individual chat with your child's teacher/s to discuss how they have settled in to their new class and to share any relevant information.

There will be a further parents' evening in the Spring term to look at children's work again and have a more formal discussion about progress and targets.

SCHOOL PHOTOS

All children should bring a school sweatshirt or cardigan on this day regardless of the weather.
